## **1. Introduction**

- 1.1 Agcarm welcomes the opportunity to comment on the discussion document 'Streamlining the regulatory regime for pest control'. As the peak industry association for crop protection and animal health manufacturers, Agcarm is supportive of simplifying the regulatory controls on vertebrate toxic agents (VTAs) through amendments to the Resource Management Act (RMA).

## **2. Recommendations**

- 2.1 Agcarm supports the proposal that the Government progresses with using section 360(1)(h) of the Resource Management Act (RMA) to simplify the regulatory framework for VTAs in New Zealand.

We are supportive of the benefits of the changes mooted in the proposal, specifically the need to reduce duplication within the current regulatory regime, and to enable consistency throughout New Zealand.
